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Mini-Lesson: Alice Paul, Women's Rights Activist

Grades: 2-6

Duration: approximately 20 minutes

OBJECTIVE:

Students will watch a short video about Alice Paul and answer 5 questions.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Give students time to watch the video (on YouTube) entitled: *Alice Paul, Women's Rights Activist*

- 2. Students answer the following 5 questions from the information in the video.
 - 1. What was the number of women that had gathered in Washington, D.C. for the first women's march?
 - 2. What were the women marching for? What was their cause?
 - 3. In which state was Alice Paul born?
 - 4. What was the Quaker faith belief that Alice Paul grew up with that influenced her decision to right for women's rights?
 - 5. In what year did the 19th Amendment give women the right to vote in the United States?
